



The UK Outlook New term, new Faces

- **Big changes in our leadership** with the newly appointed Liz Truss and unexpected change in the Monarchy. King Charles III
- Inflation rate in the UK has increased to 10% in September 2022 UK GDP growth to average between 3.1% and 3.6% The UK economy has returned to growth, partly thanks to the economic lift from hosting the Women's Euros and the Commonwealth Games (Independent)
- There is a bleak economic landscape with rising food and household bills and surging inflation, Mortgage rates have rocketed, and the UK is heading for a recession.
- New government legislation has capped the energy bills to GBP2500 capped to 2024 (BBC)
- The government's mini-budget which triggered the pound to fall to a record low against the dollar in late September
- Truss has u-turned on tax cuts for the super-rich








Where do the Wealthy live?

There are 2.49 \$ Million Millionaires and 171 Billionaires in the UK

- The richest 1% of households are each worth at least £3.6m
- Surrey and Sussex have been revealed to be the wealthiest areas of Great Britain, with residents owning assets worth an average of £263,200 each.
- Post-pandemic hybrid working conditions and overcrowding in London are **pushing those wealthier to find peace in the countryside and spacious houses**
- It also found that the wealthiest 10% of the population is estimated to hold around half of all wealth, primarily in the form of private pensions and property.








UK Luxury TravellersHigh-net-worth travellers remain unfazed by rising holiday prices


- Luxury Travel 2023 has the potential to be "even bigger" than 2019.

- UK Outbound Travel will surpass pre-pandemic levels by 2024 according to research from global data. The UK's outbound travel
 figures are estimated to reach 86.9 million by 2024 surpassing the
 84.7 million figure recorded in 2019 despite the economic decline in
 Europe.
- Google searches for *luxury travel* saw a 761.5% uplift in September
- Choice in airlines and business lounges increased as customer service levels have dropped at UK airports. Less staff means longer queues and flight disruption. An ONS survey shows that Nine out of 10 (90%) travelled by air and, of those reporting disruption, nine out of 10 (87%) suffered a flight delay.




