
Travel to Finland and to the Nordics compared to previous year and pre-pandemic

- Between July 2024 and June 2025, the **number of visitors** to Finland **rose by 3**% compared to the previous period from July 2023 to June 2024. **Leisure travel increased by 8**%, while **business travel declined by 7**%. Consequently, **leisure visitors' spending grew by 4**%, whereas **business travellers' expenditure fell by 25**% relative to the prior 12-month period.
- During the first half of 2025, registered foreign overnight stays increased by 14% compared to H1-2024. The top source markets were Germany, France, the UK, the USA, the Netherlands, and Sweden.
- Recent figures on **short-term rentals** show a **steady increase in usage throughout 2024 and into the first quarter of 2025**. Depending on the market of origin, short-term rentals can account for between 16% and over 40% of total paid overnight stays.
- The Nordic region saw strong growth in registered foreign overnight stays during the first half of 2025.
- The forecast for total international flight arrivals in Finland for the summer months of June to August has become more negative compared to earlier predictions, mainly due to multiple flight cancellations in June and July caused by industrial actions. The current outlook indicates a 2% decline in summer arrivals compared to last year.
- Looking ahead, the **Oxford Economics forecast** predicts solid growth in foreign overnight stays and spending in Finland over the next decade. The projection indicates that by 2034, **spending will almost double** and **overnight stays will rise by 63%** compared to 2024.

Latest 12 months (Jul/2024 – Jun/2025)

Foreign travellers made **nearly 5 million trips to Finland**, a **3% increase** compared to Jul/2023 – Jun/2024. However, total spending in Finland was **3.7 billion euros**, marking a **6% decrease**. Relative increase in day trips was bigger than the increase in overnight trips and the median length of stay of holiday travellers was shorter, so these were some of the reasons leading to **fewer overnight stays in Finland**.

- 90% of trips were overnight stays, slightly down from 91% previously.
- Leisure travel constituted 76% of all trips, increasing by 8%, with leisure traveller spending rising by 4%.
- Work-related trips made up 24% of all trips, but these decreased by 7%, and spending by business travellers dropped sharply by 25%.

Half of all travellers were on a holiday trip, while 20% visited friends or relatives. Holiday travel increased compared to the previous period, whereas visits to friends and relatives declined. Business travel overall decreased, except for attendees of conferences, congresses or trade fairs, whose numbers increased.


Daily spending by **holiday travellers** increased by 14%, averaging 134 euros per day, though shorter trip durations slightly reduced their average spending per trip. Among **business travellers**, those attending conferences, congresses, or trade fairs spent the most, averaging 136 euros per day.







Quarterly Review – Latest 12 Months (July 2024 – June 2025)

Most foreign travellers visited Finland during Q3, while spending peaked in Q4 and Q1

In the latest 12 months, the largest number of foreign travellers visited Finland during July–September 2024. However, the total amount of money spent by travellers was highest during October–December 2024 and January–March 2025, and during these quarters, overall spending also increased compared to previous years' corresponding quarters.

 Leisure travel to Finland saw an increase in trips and spending, except during Q3-2024.
 Leisure travellers' spending per trip and per day was highest in Q1, and winter season bookings were made almost a month earlier than summer bookings.








Quarterly Review – Latest 12 Months (July 2024 – June 2025)


- Leisure travel to Finland saw an increase in trips and spending, except during Q3-2024.

- In contrast, **business travel decreased** in Q3-2024 and during the first half of 2025, with a significant drop in spending.
- Business travellers' daily spending was fairly consistent throughout the year, peaking in Q1-2025 (€79/day) and lowest in Q3-2024 (€61/day).
- There were **fewer departure countries** and **destinations** in Finland for business travellers compared to leisure travellers.

Registered Overnights

• H1-2025

 The number of registered foreign overnights reached 3.3 million, marking an 14% increase from the previous year. Statistics Finland did not receive Åland's June statistics in time, so they had to supplement the figures for the Coastal Archipelago and overall totals using their own statistical methods. Thus, in the Rudolf database table, these estimates are included even though Åland's own statistics are missing.

Instead, the PBI Monthly Accommodation statistics report does not contain those estimates for the Coast & Archipelago area or the totals, so the figures in the PBI report are consistently too low. The correct figures for June will only be updated together with the July statistics, that is, on August 28.

- The leading source markets during the first half of year 2025 were Germany, France, UK, USA, the Netherlands, and Sweden.
- Overall accommodation revenue increased by **7%**, with **foreign revenue rising** by **20%** and domestic revenue remaining the same as in H1-2024. **Foreign revenue accounted for 39%** of the total accommodation revenue, while **foreign overnights accounted for roughly 30%** of total overnights.

• June 2025

- Total foreign overnights reached 581,900 in June (+13% YoY, & -4% compared to June 2019).
- Leading source markets in June were **Germany**, **USA**, **UK**, and **Sweden**.
- Over half of registered foreign overnights took place in Helsinki, and the number of overnights marked a new record for June with 285,000 foreign overnight stays.
 - Several major congresses took place in Helsinki this June. In addition, the Finnish Air Force hosted the multinational Atlantic Trident 25 exercise in Finland. These events brought nice growth in overnights from several source markets especially in Helsinki as well as in Tampere, Rovaniemi, Kuopio, and Jyväskylä where the Atlantic Trident air exercise took place.



During the first half of 2025, **Germany** was clearly the leading source market in terms of registered overnights. The other main source markets were **France**, **UK**, **USA**, **the** Netherlands, and Sweden.

The number of overnights surpassed the previous year's totals from all main source markets, apart from Sweden.

In comparison to H1-2019, overnights from Sweden (-13%), China including Hong Kong (-48%), Estonia (-21%), Japan (-15%), and Norway (-10%) continued to fall short of prepandemic figures.





Registered foreign overnights increased by 13% in June





Overnights in short-term rentals

- The importance of **short-term rentals via international platforms** continues to grow.
- In 2024, foreign overnights in short-term rentals added up to 2.7 million, so the total number of paid foreign overnights was 9.1 million, which was 17% more than in 2023 and 2% more than in 2019. So, when looking at the total paid foreign overnights instead of only registered overnights, travel to Finland recovered already last year to the pre-pandemic level.
- The share of foreign overnights in short-term rentals was 30% in 2024 and during January-March 2025 it was as high as 40%.
 - Number of foreign overnights in short-term rentals are following the same pattern than registered overnights – biggest increases are in winter months.
 - In 2024, the share of overnights in short-term rentals in Rovaniemi was nearly half of the total number of paid foreign overnights. Year-on-year growth rate in short-term rentals in Rovaniemi was as high as 69%.






Monthly foreign total paid overnights in Finland

The growing popularity of short-term rentals among foreign tourists highlights the noticeable recovery and strong growth of winter travel. While summer travel has also seen an uptick, it still fell short in 2024 of reaching the overnight levels seen before the pandemic.




Registered and short-term rentals overnights in Finland Year 2024

In 2024, **Germany** was the dominant market for both registered and short-term rental overnights. Germany's share of short-term rentals has also significantly risen compared to prior years.

In addition to Germany, **Finland** saw overnights in shortterm rentals of **30% or more** for visitors coming from **France**, **Spain**, **Italy**, **Estonia**, **Switzerland**, **Australia**, **Poland**, **Belgium**, and **Austria**.

When examining the total overnights (registered plus short-term rentals) in 2024 versus pre-pandemic levels in 2019, the highest relative increases among the main source markets were recorded for Italy (+52%), the US (+46%), Belgium (+45%), France (+42%), Spain (+41%), and Austria (+40%).

Registered and short-term rentals overnights in Finland - 2024







Registered and short-term rentals foreign overnights in Uusimaa & Lapland 2023-2024

The popularity of short-term rentals has notably risen, particularly in **Lapland**, where the proportion of short-term rentals increased from 27% in 2023 to **35%** in **2024**. In **Rovaniemi**, almost half of all paid foreign overnight stays occurred in **short-term rentals**.


The annual growth rate for overnight stays in short-term rentals in Lapland reached 64%, while in Rovaniemi, it soared to 69%.

In Lapland, the total number of paid foreign overnight stays rose by 27%, and in Uusimaa, there was a 15% increase in 2024 compared to the previous year.






Foreign overnights in other Finnish regions - Year 2023




Foreign overnights in other Finnish regions - Year 2024

Foreign overnights in some other Finnish municipalities - Year 2024





 The Nordic region has experienced good growth in registered foreign overnight stays from January to June 2025.




Monthly overnights in the Nordics 2024 – H1/2025





Flight bookings for Jun-Aug 2025


- Outlook for the total international flight arrivals to Finland for the summer months of June August has turned to more negative compared to the previous forecasts. This is mainly due to several flight cancellations in June and July due to industrial actions. The current outlook for arrivals show a 2% decrease compared to last year. When comparing to summer 2019, the total int'l arrival numbers are 21% below that level.
- Bookings for the summer months to Norway are growing strongly when comparing to both previous summer as well as to summer 2019. Bookings to Sweden are slightly increasing compared to previous summer, but decreasing compared to summer prepandemic.



June – August 2025


- Total int'l seat capacity for the summer months of June August has slightly decreased compared to the previously planned as the strikes have contributed to several flight cancellations in June and July. As a result, total int'l seat capacity to Finland for the summer is 2% above 2024 level, but 16% below the pre-pandemic level.
 - As the flight cancellations have affected mainly the European flights, seat capacity from **Europe** is only 1% above the level of summer season 2024. *Compared to summer 2019, seat capacity on European flights is on a 13% lower level.*
 - Seat capacity from **Asia** improves by 10% compared to previous summer *but remains 38% below the level of summer 2019*.
 - > Seat capacity from **USA** is clearly above both summer 2024 and summer 2019 levels.

Comparison to previous summer and pre-pandemic






