

Summary

Travel to Finland and to the Nordics compared to previous year and pre-pandemic

- Border survey leisure up, business down: In the latest Aug 2024–Jul 2025 period, foreign travellers made 5.0 million trips to Finland (+3% YoY) with total spending of €3.7 billion (−3% YoY). Leisure travel dominates (76% of visits) and grew robustly (+8% in trips, +5% in spend). In contrast, business travel (24% of trips) declined −8% in trip volume, with spending falling −21%. Notably, holiday tourism and conference trips clearly increased.
- Registered overnight stays rising: 712,500 foreign overnight stays were recorded in July 2025 (+9% YoY), although still 10% below July 2019 levels. During Jan–Jul 2025, 4.0 million foreign overnights were registered in Finland, up +13% from 2024 and just 1% shy of Jan–Jul 2019.
 - Key source markets: Germany remains the top source market of foreign overnights (Jan–Jul 2025), followed by Sweden, France, the UK, USA, and Netherlands. All major markets grew compared to 2024. However, some markets are still catching up to pre-pandemic volumes e.g. overnight stays from Sweden are –6% vs 2019, Estonia –18%, Japan –14%, and China (incl. HK) –49% compared to Jan–Jul 2019 whereas North American and many European markets now exceed 2019 levels.

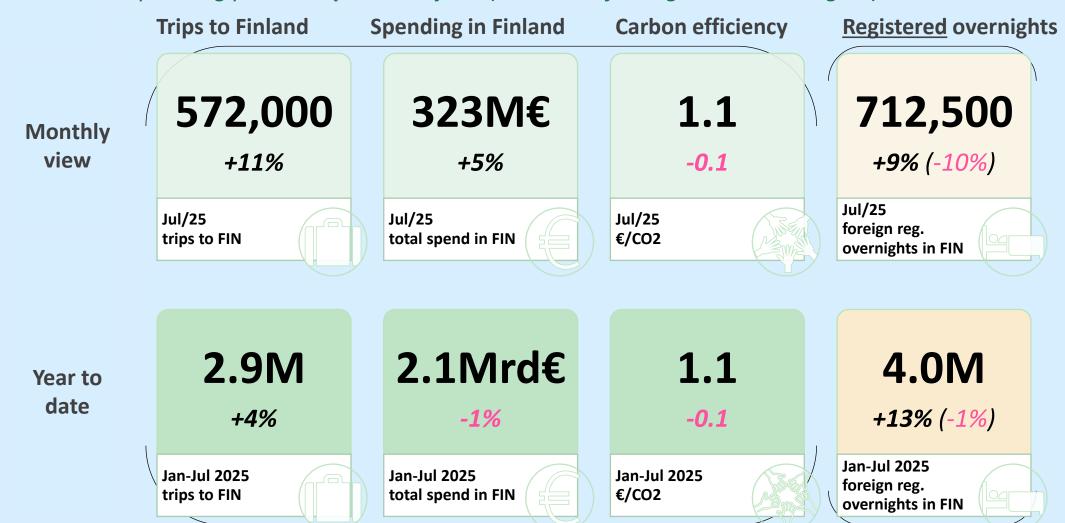
Travel to Finland and to the Nordics compared to previous year and pre-pandemic

- The Nordic region: Experienced good growth in registered foreign overnight stays from January to July 2025. Among the four Nordic countries (SE, DK, NO, FI), Finland's share of the foreign overnights was 13% (Sweden leading with a 33% share).
 - Germany is clearly the biggest source market, and their overnights have increased in each of the four Nordic countries.
 - Beside Germany, overnights increased to each Nordic country from the US, the Netherlands, Sweden,
 Denmark, France, Switzerland, Finland, Spain, Belgium, and China among the main source markets.
- Winter 2025–26 outlook: The upcoming high winter season is expected to see further recovery in inbound travel. International seat capacity to Finland in Dec 2025–Feb 2026 is projected +6% higher than last winter (almost back to 2019 levels). Flight arrivals to Finland are forecasted to increase by +4% vs winter 2024-2025 (helped by improved connectivity to Helsinki and airports in Lapland region). Several key origin markets are expected to grow compared to both previous winter and winter 2019, reflecting a robust rebound in demand. The strong air capacity from the US and Europe is poised to offset slower Asian recovery, pointing to another positive winter tourism season for Finland.

Latest 12 months (Aug/2024 – Jul/2025)

Foreign travellers made **5 million trips to Finland**, a **3% increase** compared to Aug/2023 – Jul/2024. However, total spending in Finland was **3.7 billion euros**, marking a **3% decrease**.

- Leisure travel constituted **76%** of all trips, increasing by **8%**, with leisure traveller spending rising by **5%**.
- Work-related trips made up 24% of all trips, but these decreased by 8%, and spending by business travellers dropped by 21%.

Over half of all travellers were on a **holiday trip**, while **19% visited friends or relatives**. Holiday travel increased compared to the previous period, whereas visits to friends and relatives declined. **Business travel overall decreased**, except for attendees of conferences, congresses or trade fairs, whose numbers clearly increased.

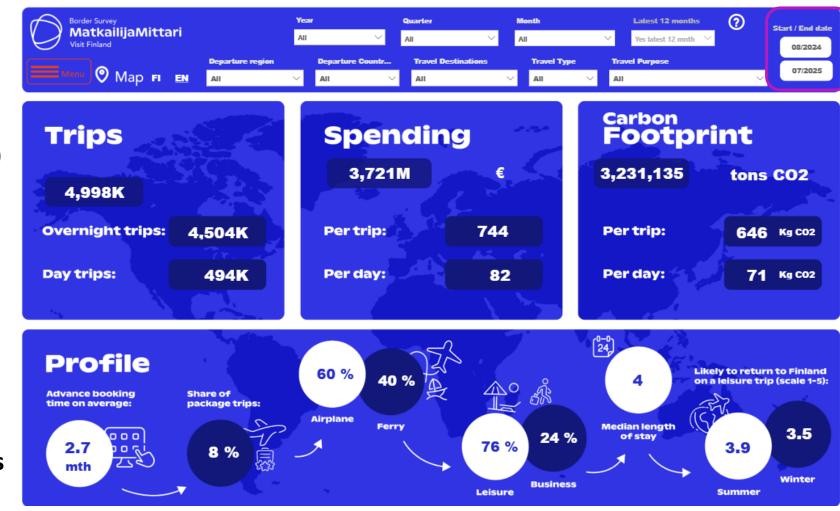
Daily spending by **holiday travellers** increased by 8%, averaging 131 euros per day. Among **business travellers**, those attending conferences, congresses, or trade fairs spent the most, averaging 134 euros per day.

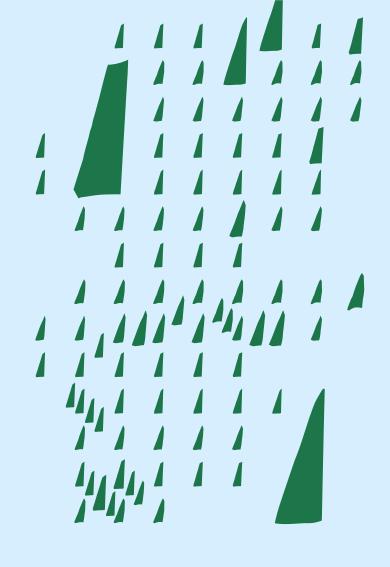
January-July 2025

Trips increased by 4%, but **total spend was slightly lower** than in January-July 2024.

- Vacation and recreational trips and total spend both increased by 18%.
- Business travel as a whole decreased by 6% and total spend by 20%. However, trips to conferences, congresses or fairs increased clearly (+34%) and the total spend of these visitors increased by 16% compared to the previous year.

The largest number of visitors originated from **Estonia**, **Sweden**, **Germany**, the **UK**, and **France**.

Visitors from **Germany**, **France**, **Estonia**, the **USA**, and the **UK** were the main contributors to the total spend in Finland.





Leisure travel increased, business travel decreased in Jan-Jul 2025

- Leisure travel to Finland increased by 8% during January-July 2025. Visitors travelling for leisure purposes also spent 8% more in Finland compared to Jan-Jul 2024.
- On the other hand, business travel decreased at the same time by 6% and the total spend by business travellers decreased as much as 20% compared to Jan-Jul 2024.

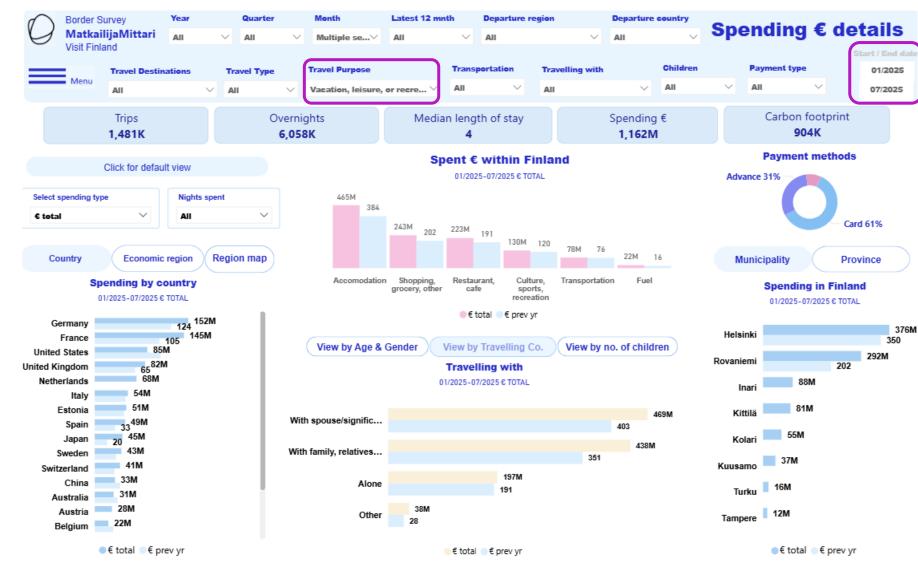

Spend by vacation travellers in Finland during Jan-Jul 2025

Jan-Jul 2025 vs. Jan-Jul 2024

- Total spend was highest for vacation travellers coming from Germany and France, and their total spend also increased clearly compared to the previous year.
- Rovaniemi was clearly benefitting from the higher total spend of the holiday makers.
- 40% of the total spend of the holiday makers was used for accommodation. The shares of shopping (incl. grocery) as well as restaurants and cafes counted both around 20% of total spend.

Registered Overnights

• Jan-Jul 2025

- The number of registered foreign overnights reached **4.0 million**, marking an **13%** increase from the previous year.
- The leading source markets were Germany, Sweden, France, UK, USA, and the Netherlands.
- Overall accommodation revenue increased by 5%, with foreign revenue rising by 18% and domestic revenue
 decreasing by 2% compared to the same period last year. Foreign revenue accounted for 36% of the total
 accommodation revenue, while foreign overnights accounted for 29% of total overnights.

• July 2025

- Total foreign overnights reached 712,500 in July (+9% YoY, & -10% compared to July 2019).
- Leading source markets in July were Sweden, Germany, and USA.
- 43% of registered foreign overnights took place in **Helsinki**, and the number of overnights marked a new record for July with 303,400 foreign overnight stays.
 - Biggest source market for Helsinki was USA with 35,200 overnights (+53% YoY). Germany with 32,400 overnights came second (+12%). Overnights increased also from nearly all main source markets compared to previous year.

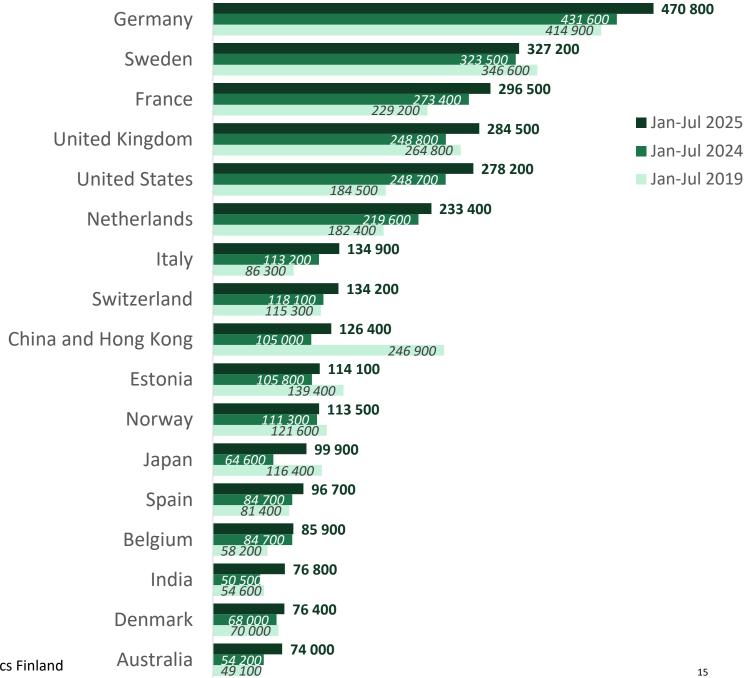
January – July 2025

Between January and July 2025, **Germany** remained the top source market for **registered overnights**. Other significant source markets included **Sweden**, **France**, **the UK**, **USA**, and **the Netherlands**.

Overnight stays from all major source markets exceeded the totals recorded in the previous year.

Compared to January-July 2019, overnight stays from Sweden (-6%), China including Hong Kong (-49%), Estonia (-18%), Norway (-7%), and Japan (-14%) still lagged behind pre-pandemic levels.

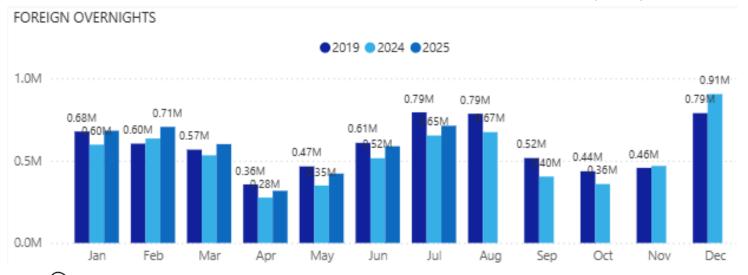

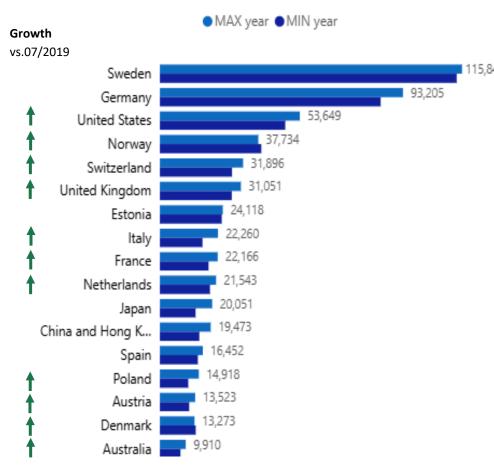

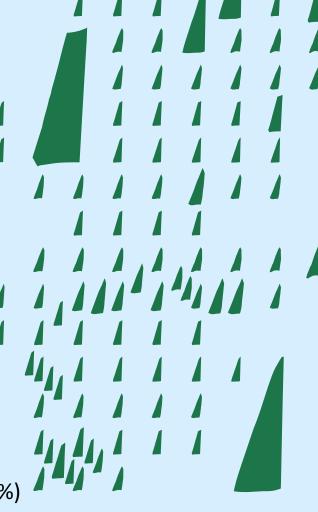

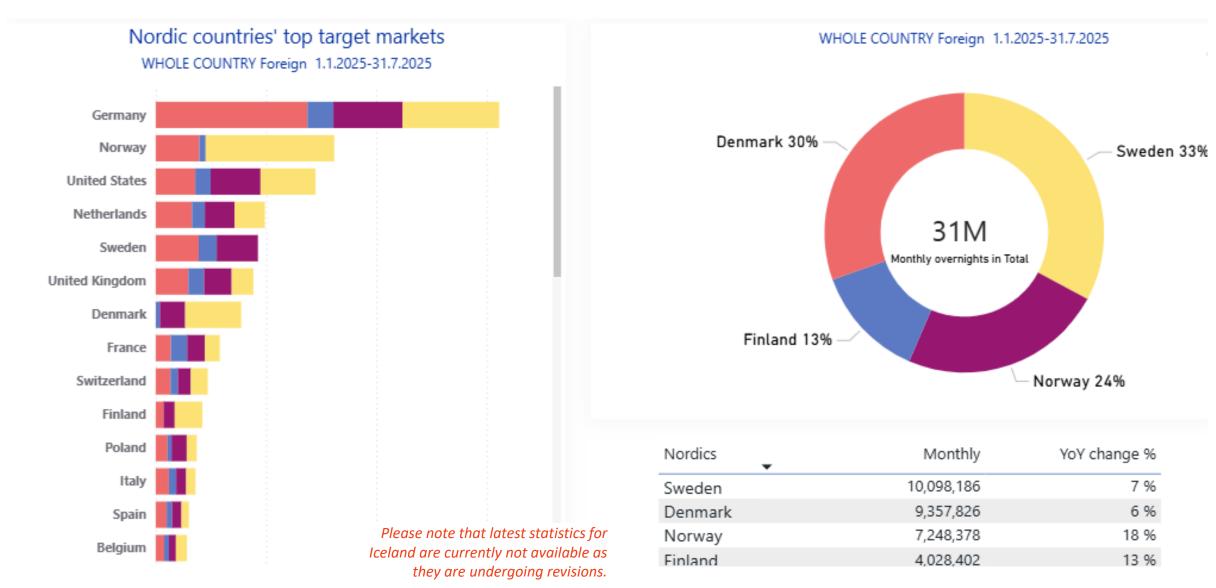
July 2025

- In July 2025, the number of foreign overnight stays increased in each of the four Nordic countries; Sweden (+6%), Denmark (+6%), Norway (+19%), and Finland (+9%) compared to previous year.
- Sweden holds a 38% share of the foreign overnights in July, Denmark 30%, Norway 25%, and Finland only 7%. Sweden receives a good number of visitors from the other Nordic countries during the popular holiday month being July in the Nordics.



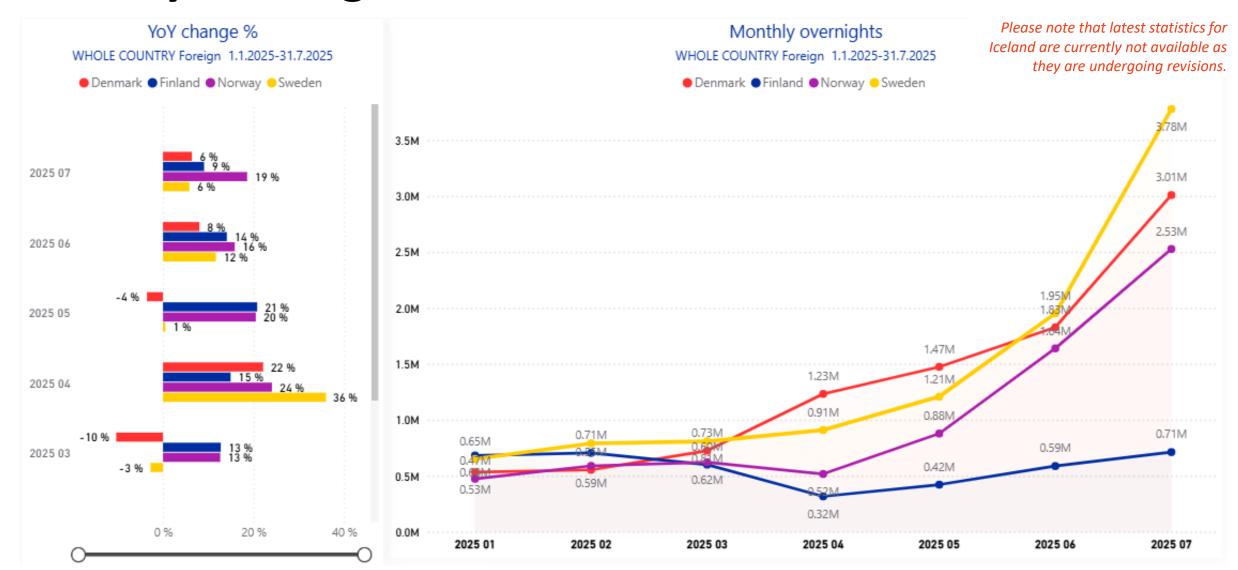


Foreign overnights in the Nordics Jan-Jul 2025





Monthly overnights in the Nordics Jan-Jul 2025



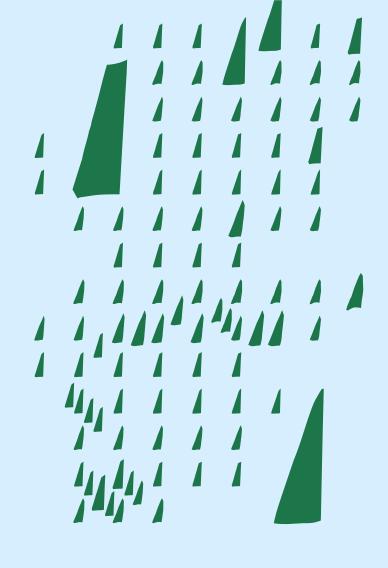

International Flight Seat Capacity Dec 2025 – Feb 2026

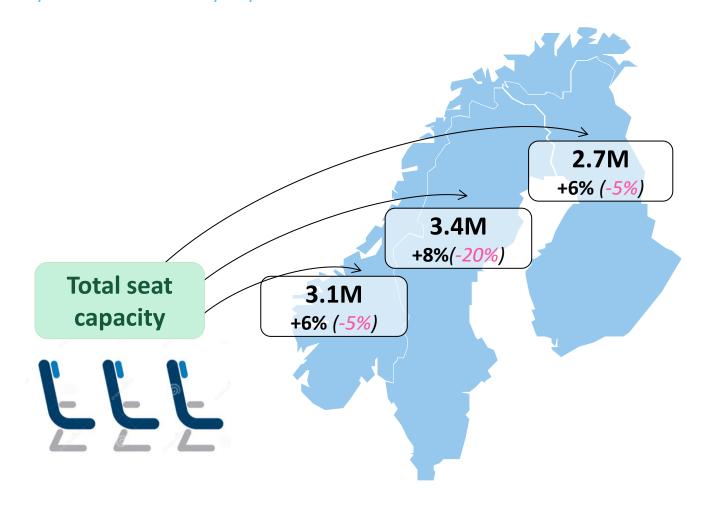
- Overall int'l seat capacity to Finland during the high winter season is showing a 6% increase compared to last winter.
 - Seat capacity from **Europe** is set to grow by 6%, reaching levels comparable to those before the pandemic. Weekly flights from Europe will increase to both Helsinki and airports in the Lapland region.
 - Seat capacity from **Asia** rises by 10% from the previous winter, though it remains 32% lower than the winter of 2019.
 - Seat capacity from the **USA** is significantly higher than both last winter (+20%) and the winter of 2019 (+81%).

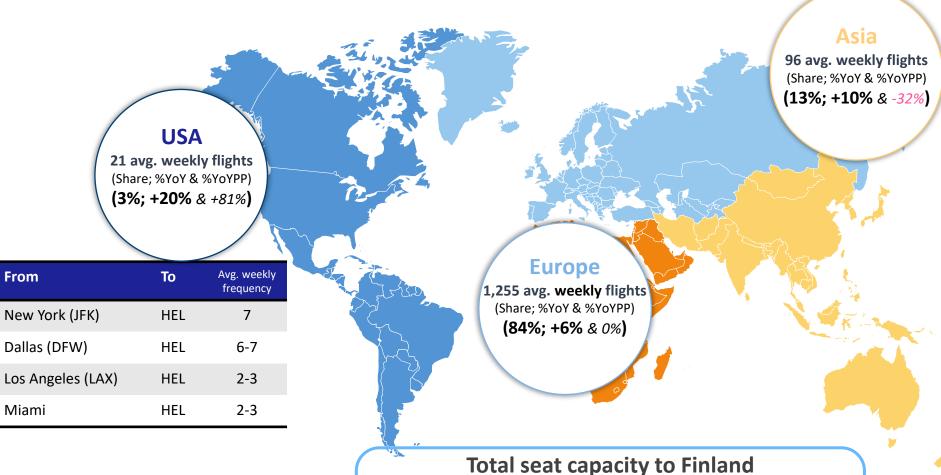

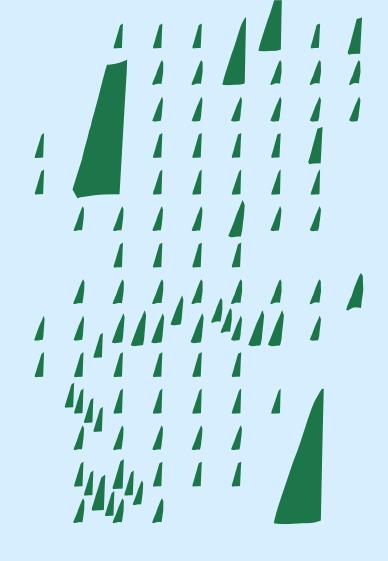

Forecast for Flight Arrivals December 2025 – February 2026

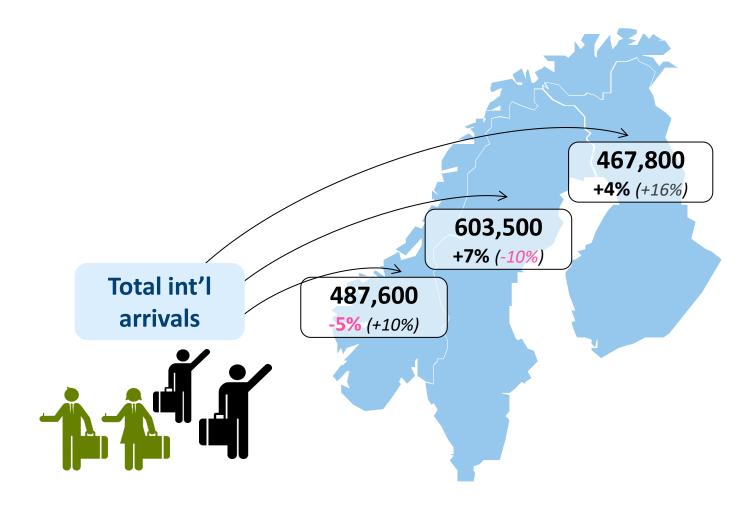
- The forecast for **total international flight arrivals to Finland** during the **high winter season** of December 2025 to February 2026 indicates **growth** compared to both the previous winter and the pre-pandemic winter period.
 - Arrivals from the UK, Netherlands, Spain, Switzerland, Denmark, USA,
 Poland, and Ireland are projected to surpass levels seen in both the previous winter and in 2019.
 - Connectivity to Helsinki and Lapland is clearly improving compared to previous winter, so the forecast for arrivals especially to Lapland is very positive.
- Flight arrivals to Sweden are anticipated to rise compared to last winter,
 though they are expected to remain below pre-pandemic figures.
- While flight arrivals from **Norway** have consistently increased on a year-onyear basis each season since the pandemic, a **decline** is **expected this winter** compared to the previous year.

Comparison to previous winter and pre-pandemic



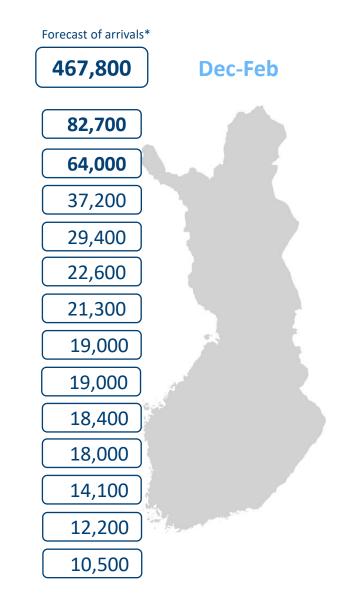

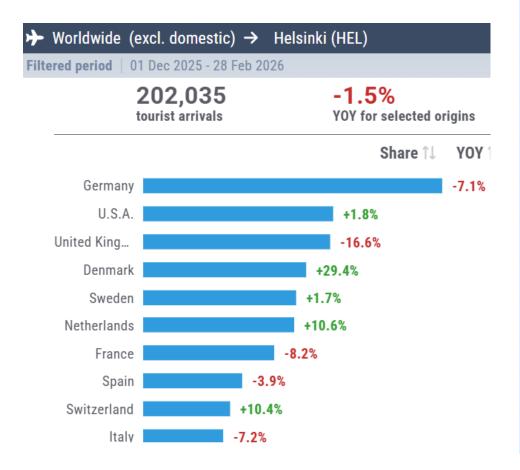
